

- CSF works together with farmers, agronomists and organisations in priority areas across England to improve the quality of our water and air.







Biobed options

RP24 – Lined biobed plus pesticide loading and washdown area, £118/m2

RP25 – Lined biobed with existing washdown area, £77/m2













Biofilter

RP26 – biofilters, £990/unit











RP28 - Roofing sprayer washdown area, £62/m2

RP27 – Sprayer or applicator load and washdown area, £40/m2













Rainwater harvesting: **RP16 – Rainwater** goods, £11.40/m **RP17 - Storage** tanks underground, £250/m3 RP18 - Above ground tanks, £100m3 **RP19 - First flush** rainwater diverters and downpipe filters, £125/unit











Useful field options include:

SW1: 4m to 6m buffer strip on cultivated land, £353/ha

SW4: 12m to 24m watercourse buffer strip on cultivated land, £512/ha


